Day 1 - Nice

****Capital of the Cote d 'Azur****, Nice is surrounded by an amphitheatre of hills and mountains that protects it from the wind. You will probably want to explore the Promenade des Anglais, where you can sit on one of the famous blue chairs laid out opposite the baie des Anges. The Chateau hill is also a very pleasant place to walk. This is the entrance to the ****old city,**** with its bustling markets and regional products along the main street, the Cours Saleya.

Day 2 - Ajaccio, Corsica

Birth town of ****Napoleon Bonaparte,**** ****Ajaccio**** occupies a privileged location on the Île de Beauté. Rich in history and culture, the old "imperial city" is imbued with the memory of this son of the soil. His presence is tangible, from the ****citadel**** to the ****imperial chapel,**** without forgetting the statues of the emperor in several of the city's squares. As you stroll through the shaded streets in the old town centre, you'll come across the ****central market on place Foch,**** where you can taste one or two local specialties, for instance, brocciu, lonzu or the famous canistrelli.

Day 3 - Calvi, Corsica

Nestled on a rocky spur in the north-west of Corsica, the port of ****Calvi**** offers its whiteness between two sapphire-coloured bays. Capital of the ****Balagne**** region, the Genoese city benefits from an exceptional natural setting between the abrupt relief of the central chain, fertile hills and long sandy beaches. From the promontory of the ****Notre-Dame-de-la-Serra chapel****, built in the 19th century on the ruins of a 15th century sanctuary, you will not miss the sublime panorama of the seaside, the mountains and the Calvi citadel. A little further west, you will have the opportunity to discover with the

****peninsula of Revelatta****, a wilder and more preserved part of Corsica.

Day 4 - Cassis

A discreet outpost of the glittering French Riviera, the port of ****Cassis**** masterfully plays its Provençal music. Between the ****stunning calanques coves**** and ****Cap Canaille****, the town stretches out with charming southern houses, their blinds repainted countless times, while the port exudes such a sunny and recognisable feeling, giving everything here a festive spirit. The surroundings are also well worth the visit: hills drooping beneath the vines, parasol pines curling up into the azure of the sky, prickly pears hanging onto white limestone, the Provence of the Fauvist painters unveils itself in this idyllic spot.

Day 5 - Marseille

The oldest harbour in France, ****Marseille**** is the city where PONANT has chosen to set up its company headquarters. Heart vibrating in its setting of Mediterranean Calanques, it reveals its raw and authentic beauty, made up of a thousand influences and cultures which, over the centuries, have made up its wealth. A stroll through the ****Old Port**** will allow you to discover the places corresponding to the city founded by the Greeks as well as ****Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde Basilica****, with its astonishing neo-Byzantine architecture, which overlooks it. Close to the quays, the Place de Lenche, which covers the ancient agora, will be perfect for a break in one of its lively cafes before melting into the maze of narrow streets with colourful houses in the ****Panier district****, just a stone's throw away.

Day 6 - Port-Vendres

The coastal town of ****Port-Vendres**** stands proudly in the heart of the Roussillon region. In the curve of a sheltered bay,

The 17th-century fortifications, erected by Vauban, bear witness to its strategic importance to the defence of France. The coastal town's many charming features include its cobblestoned streets, edged with houses with colourful façades, which gracefully wind their way to the fishing port, where traditional boats mingle with luxury yachts. In the distance, the foothills of the Alberes tumble down to the coast, offering a green setting for this haven of peace where there is a harmonious blend of the hustle and bustle of the quays and the serenity of walks on the ramparts.

Day 7 - Rosas

Lying between sea and mountains, the seaside resort of Rosas is part of the province of Girona in Spain, in central **Costa Brava**. You will be charmed by the **historic Renaissance citadel**, as well as the wide sandy beaches and coves with their crystal-clear waters on the edge of the town. Restaurants serving typical Catalan cuisine and numerous bars all make Rosas a lively tourist destination.

Day 8 - Tarragona

Tarragona is situated on the Costa Dorada, in the south of Spain's Catalonia region. Known as Tarraco in Roman times, the city boasts very important archaeological and architectural vestiges that are magnificently well preserved. These earned it a place on the UNESCO World Heritage list in 2000. Do not miss this opportunity to visit **the Roman amphitheatre**, which is located on a beautiful natural site by the sea and is exceptionally well preserved. A stroll through the streets of the old medieval town to the cathedral, which was completed in the 14th century, is a wonderful way to end your visit to this welcoming city.

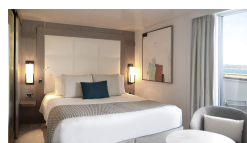

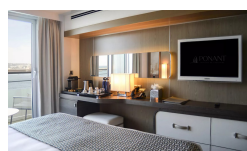
