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ARUBA TO GRENADA 10 NIGHTS CARIBBEAN CRUISE

This sailing from Oranjestad to St. George's traces a relaxed arc through the southern Caribbean, pairing Dutch-colonial capitals with the secluded anchorages of the Grenadines and Tobago. After departing Aruba and calling in colorful Willemstad, days under sail highlight the rhythm of tall-ship cruising before reaching the quiet shores of Charlestown Bay and the protected reefs of Tobago Cays. Stops in Admiralty Bay, Charlotteville, Castara Bay and Saline Bay showcase fishing villages, rainforest-backed beaches and clear turquoise waters before arriving in Grenada's spice-scented capital.



ITINERARY

Day 1 Oranjestad, Aruba

Bon boni means welcome in the local dialect, Papiamentu, and it's universally understood by all who visit little Aruba. Just 15 miles from Venezuela, this almost independent nation still has a ceremonial Dutch Governor General. Once it depended on oil for income, but tourism is the new king. No wonder Aruba's endless beaches and spectacular diving are too tempting to pass up.

Day 2 Willemstad, Curacao

The gabled houses and warehouses of Dutch colonial Willemstad march in tight formation along the entrance to St.

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Anna Bay, an incongruous vision of a tropical Amsterdam where the floating market sells mangos and papayas instead of tulips. In Curacao's interior cunucu, a few Dutch landhuis or farm owners still wrest a living by ranching on the near-desert soil.

Days 3 - 4 At sea

Each Star Clippers ship offers a traditional and elegant way to see the world. Feel the wind fill the sails and gently carry you from one gorgeous destination to the next. During your time on board, you can choose to relax on a sun lounger or cool off in one of the pools on the top deck, while more adventurous passengers may enjoy the opportunity to climb the rigging or even have a go at steering the ship. Alternatively, you can wander the interior areas of the ship and discover relaxing lounges, a revitalising spa (Royal Clipper only) and a peaceful library.

Day 5 Charlestown Bay, Canouan, Grenadines

Nestled amidst lush tropical foliage, Charlestown Bay offers visitors a serene retreat surrounded by natural beauty. The bay is perfect for swimming, snorkeling, and sunbathing, while nearby amenities provide opportunities for beachside relaxation and local culinary delights.

Day 6 Tobago Cays, Grenadines

Four small islets, virtually deserted but enormously appealing for those who love underwater exploration, Tobago Cays is a

national park where snorkelling is superb.

Day 7 Admiralty Bay, Bequia, Grenadines

Star Clipper usually anchors in the lee of ruggedly beautiful Young Island lying just 54 feet off the southern tip of St. Vincent which is just a 10 minute ferry ride away. Day 8 Charlotteville, Tobago

Charlotteville is a tranquil fishing village nestled along the rugged northeastern coast of the island, known for its unspoiled beauty and relaxed atmosphere. Day 9 Castara Bay, Tobago

With its pristine sandy shores and calm turquoise waters, Castara Bay is an ideal spot for swimming, snorkeling, and simply unwinding while taking in the breathtaking views. The village of Castara nearby provides a glimpse into local life, with charming guesthouses, vibrant fishing traditions, and delicious Creole cuisine.

Day 10 Saline Bay, Mayreau, Grenadines

Day 11 St. George's, Grenada

The aromas of nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla baking in the sun - these are the tropical flavours of Grenada. From the horseshoe shaped Carenage at St. George's, follow the Sendall Tunnel (hand-built in 1895) to the Esplanade and old Ft. George for a spectacular view of Grenada.
