ITINERARY

Day 1 - Tarragona

****Tarragona**** is situated on the Costa Dorada, in the south of Spain's Catalonia region. Known as Tarraco in Roman times, the city boasts very important archaeological and architectural vestiges that are magnificently well preserved. These earned it a place on the UNESCO World Heritage list in 2000. Do not miss this opportunity to visit ****the Roman amphitheatre****, which is located on a beautiful natural site by the sea and is exceptionally well preserved. A stroll through the streets of the old medieval town to the cathedral, which was completed in the 14th century, is a wonderful way to end your visit to this welcoming city.

Day 2 - Collioure

****Collioure**** is a delightful little Catalan port, a link between the ****Pyrenees and the Mediterranean****, backing onto the Alberes massif, from which vines tumble down towards the sea. From the port, you'll spot the ****Church of Our Lady of the Angels****, whose bell tower has assimilated the former lighthouse, and the imposing silhouette of the ****royal medieval castle****, a designated historic monument. It was successively home to the kings of Majorca, Aragon, Spain and France. Wandering the narrow alleyways of the ****old town****, you'll discover colourful houses distilling a melodious palette enhanced by the Mediterranean sun. It is no accident that the ****Fauve movement****, led by Matisse, created a new pictorial language here, bringing together colour and emotion.

Day 3 - Cassis

A discreet outpost of the glittering French Riviera, the port of ****Cassis**** masterfully plays its Provençal music. Between the ****stunning calanques coves**** and ****Cap Canaille****, the town stretches out with charming southern houses, their blinds repainted countless times, while the port exudes such a sunny and recognisable feeling, giving everything here a festive spirit. The surroundings are also well worth the visit: hills drooping beneath the vines, parasol pines curling up into the azure of the sky, prickly pears hanging onto white limestone, the Provence of the Fauvist painters unveils itself in this idyllic spot.

Day 4 - Menton

****City of art and history****, Menton is located at the far eastern side of the Cote d'Azur. You will be won over by the Provence houses with their palms and lemon trees. Very close to the ****Saint-Michel-Archange basilica****, take a mosey around the charming place aux Herbes, and the medieval streets that follow

a sinuous plan. Here and there, you can see snatches of the coastline. These picturesque points of view have attracted artists since the beginning of the 20th century. Don't miss works by the most famous Menton figure: ****Jean Cocteau****. They are exhibited in two museums: the Bastion museum and the Severin-Wunderman collection.

Day 5 - Portofino

Close to the Cinque Terre, ****Portofino**** is the jewel of the ****Ligurian Riviera****. This "small village that stretches like a half moon around a silent basin", described by Guy de Maupassant, is today a pretty, lively little port that has managed to preserve the authenticity of its maritime traditions, which have been recognised since Ancient times. Built in the hollow of a small natural cove sheltered by the pine forest, the village is at the heart of a ****protected maritime reserve****. The shimmering colours of its house fronts and the exceptional location of this village have inspired many authors and artists. You will also see the ****Portofino lighthouse****, immaculate in its green setting. Perched on the ****Punta del Capo****, it watches over the peninsula and its postcard setting.

Day 6 - Livorno

On the ligurian coast, ****Livorno**** invites us to ****Tuscany****, a charming region offering ****archaeological vestiges****, ****Renaissance**** treasures, undulating landscapes and a pleasant way of life. When the ****Medicis**** arrived in the 16th century they developed the city, which became ****one of the most important ports in the Mediterranean.**** Cosmopolitan and multireligious, Livorno has welcomed many immigrants and is a wonderful example of cultural diversity. Built during that period, ****Fortezza Vecchia**** and ****Fortezza Nuova**** attest to the city's power. At the foot of the new fort, ****Nuova Venezia****



is an enchanting district with small canals and streets to stroll along to discover a few architectural treasures, such as the magnificent Santa Caterina da Siena church in the Tuscan baroque style.

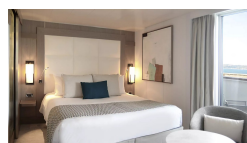

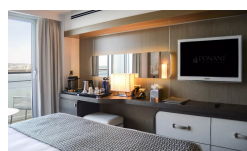
