Day 3 Newport, RI

Nestled within Narragansett Bay is Newport, the yachting capital of the world. Day 6 Camden, ME

Full of classic schooners, this charming village is considered the "tall ship capital of Maine". Enjoy the summer sun and

refreshing sea breeze as you watch beautiful ships sail into the harbor, or browse the quaint shops and art galleries. Bring your camera to capture ocean vistas, placid coastlines and panoramic views of Camden, Penobscot Bay and surrounding islands from atop Mount Battie.

Day 7 Bar Harbor, ME

Nestled on the east side of Mt. Desert Island and surrounded by Acadia National Park, Bar Harbor's breathtaking vistas and abundant wildlife have welcomed visitors for over one hundred years. Some cruises may go to Bar Harbor via coach from Bucksport. Please call for details.

Day 8 Rockland, ME
